### REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Developmental Disabilities Council will have a maximum amount up to \$200,000.00 established for Community Supports priority area programming for Fiscal Year 2020- 2021.

The DD Council is soliciting proposals for projects that implement evidence-based approaches that improve community inclusion of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

#### State Plan Goal 2: Community Supports

People with intellectual and developmental disabilities have access to their own choice of formal and informal community-based services, supports, resources, and activities throughout their lifetime.

#### Objective 2

Support at least two programs that provide people with intellectual and developmental disabilities opportunities to improve community integration, inclusion, and productivity.

Additional proposal requirements:

#### Defined Concepts

<b>Integration</b>	<i>Exercising the equal rights of individuals with developmental disabilities to access and use the same community resources as are used by and available to other individuals.</i>
<b>Inclusion</b>	<i>Taking full advantage of their integration into the same community resources as individuals without disabilities, living, learning, working, and enjoying life in regular contact with individuals without disabilities.</i>
<b>Productivity</b>	<i>Engaging in income-producing work that is measured by increased income, improved employment status, or job advancement, or engagement in work that contributes to a household or community.</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Productivity includes income-producing activities, volunteer/service activities, and civic engagement activities in the community.</li></ul>

- Implement evidence-based approaches to community inclusion and organizational change.
- Include a professional development component for staff to increase their skills in person-centered service delivery, organizational planning, and/or person-centered quality management.
- Include strategies for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to build relationships leading to increased self-determination, independence, inclusion, and productivity in the community.
- Include strategies for cooperation among service delivery providers, case management organizations, and other relevant organizations.
- Proposals must describe how the project aligns with the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Final Rule which values individuals receiving programming based on personally-defined outcomes in the most integrated community setting possible, in a manner that reflects personal choices and preferences, and which contributes to the assurance of health and wellness.
- Priority is given to proposals that include a self advocate over 22 years old or family member in proposal development, oversight, decision making, and/or as a paid employee under the grant.
- Include letters of collaboration from project stakeholders describing each partner's specific contribution to grant activities.
- Proposal must include a S.M.A.R.T. work plan: specific, measurable, achievable, realistic, and timed.
